

If you are taking measurements to place an order please follow this guide. If you have any questions please do not hesitate to contact us for assistance, as it is most important that your measurements are correct.

You require

- A fabric tape measure.
- A person to measure you.
- To be wearing a comfortable fitting shirt, pair of trousers (not jeans) or an existing pair of plus fours or twos.

When taking the measurements

- Keep the tape measure comfortably snug, but not too tight.
- All measurements should be taken to the nearest centimetre or half inch.

Waist

- Measure around your waist, just inside where you like the top of your plus fours/twos to sit.
- Make sure the tape does not ride over the waistband but you should be able to put your index finger inside the tape.



Seat

- This should be taken at the widest point.
- Ensure your pockets are empty.

Inside Leg

- Wearing plus fours/twos or trousers, measure from the lowest part of the crotch of your trousers down to where you wish the plus fours/twos to end below the knee.
- We recommend you err on the generous side with this measurement as the plus fours will tend to ride up when you bend your leg. Because the bottom end of the plus four leg is much higher than in normal trousers, it is important it does not ride up around your knee joint but always remains comfortably below the knee.



Outside Leg

- Wearing plus fours/twos or trousers, measure from the top of the waistband to where you wish the plus fours/twos to end below the knee.
- Obviously, this should be the same distance below the knee as in the inside leg measurement.



Garter Measurement

- Over your bare leg, measure the circumference of your calf at the point where you wish the plus fours/twos to be secured.



Note

There is no need for you to make any adjustment in your measurements to allow for the difference between plus two's and plus fours. Simply follow the instructions above and our tailor will make the necessary adjustment depending on the choice you have made.
